Preparation for British Boarding School
Pre-GCSE

## Preparation for British Boarding School Pre-A-Level / Pre-IB

The Pre-A-Level online course will run on the same time structure as the Pre-GCSE Course with four lessons every day from Monday to Saturday, a total of 24 lessons. Each lesson is 45 minutes long. Each Pre-A-Level online student will receive an individual timetable to include their three chosen subjects.

**English Language**: five lessons a week focusing on speaking and listening skills
